The Bilingual Science Education Intern will play a key role in this project in terms of translating and delivering our new curriculum-based programs in French, serving the needs of this large Alberta community.

The Bilingual Science Education Intern will work within our existing School Programs team to provide fresh perspective to our program planning, as well as translating existing programs into French for the first time. The incumbent will have the opportunity to work on this program from the ground up from program development, education and evaluation in both official languages and translate all of our science and education programming to hundreds and thousands of kids each day and year.

- Create a schedule of evaluation for each of the 12-15 programs
- Together with the Manager of School Programs, create and refine a system of evaluation for the programs
- Test programs with various schools and TWOSE camps. This may include delivery, observation, and evaluation in conjunction with the rest of the Education team.
- Create a report with recommendations for modification and expansion of the programs, including suggestions for

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- Help liaise with French Immersion and francophone schools to secure program bookings and maintain relationships
