Requirements

Northern Coding Academy's student programs, including the Coding School, are provided for free to populations in rural, northern, and urban high-needs areas. To participate, **your school must meet one** of the following criteria:

Rural: Your school's city must have a population under 100,000 and not be connected to a major urban center.

Note: A city connected to a major urban center, such as Sherwood Park connected to Edmonton, would not qualify as rural.

Northern: To be considered northern, your school must be located above the 54th parallel. You can verify this by checking its latitude on Google Maps (google.ca/maps) by typing in the school's address and right-clicking on the map.

For example, TELUS World of Science- Edmonton, with a latitude of 53.56112, would not be considered northern by Northern Coding Academy's definition.

Urban High Needs: The definition of Urban High Needs is not specified in our grant. If you believe your school may be eligible as "Urban High Needs" please contact us. You can make the case for your school's eligibility as Urban High Needs by contacting us via [video chat](#) or [email](#). Possible reasons for consideration may include a high percentage of low-income students, inadequate access to technology, or location in a low-income area.

Important Note:
