The Art of the Brick media preview allows you to discover this immersive exhibition with opportunities for photography and video to be captured. Exhibition highlights include:

- Fan favourite original piece "Yellow," a life-size sculpture of a man pulling his chest apart with thousands of yellow LEGO bricks flowing from the cavity.
- A multimedia collection of LEGO brick infused photography produced in tandem with award-winning photographer Dean West.
- A 20-foot Tyrannosaurus Rex skeleton made entirely of LEGO bricks.
- Interactive experiences including a LEGO drag race, mystery object build, free build area, and more.
