

Jurassic World Dinosaurs Descend on TELUS World of Science – Edmonton

EDMONTON, AB – July 3, 2025 – The Canadian Premiere of an immersive Brickman experience featuring over 50 epic creations made from 6 million LEGO® bricks is coming to TELUS World of Science – Edmonton. More than fifteen dinosaurs will roar into the Science Centre when the *Jurassic World by Brickman*® exhibition opens on October 11, 2025, at TELUS World of Science - Edmonton.

Created by Ryan ‘Brickman’ McNaught, the popular exhibition will bring to life *Jurassic World* – the blockbuster franchise from Universal Pictures and Amblin Entertainment. With over 50 large-scale dinosaurs, props, scenes and activities made from over 6 million LEGO® bricks, the immersive must-do adventure provides inquisitive explorers an interactive and thrilling journey through stories and characters from the *Jurassic World* franchise.

Weighing in at 750 kg, the fan favourite Jurassic World by Brickman dinosaur, the T. rex, took 1235 hours to design and was created using 278,366 LEGO® bricks! She is 2.4 m long, over 1.5 m wide and stands 3.2 m high. Jurassic World by Brickman tickets go on sale to the public starting July 3, 2025, and is brought to Edmonton thanks to TEG Live and Brickman®.

The Brickman is a highly skilled team of LEGO brick model builders and craftspeople, led by one of the world’s leading LEGO brick artists, star judge of the award-winning TV show LEGO® Masters Australia, and only LEGO® Certified Professional (LCP) in the southern hemisphere, Ryan ‘Brickman’ McNaught. Visitors to *Jurassic World by Brickman* begin by walking through the iconic 4-metre-tall *Jurassic World* gates to experience the island itself, then the inner workings of the *Jurassic World* lab, where dinosaurs are genetically engineered.

Explorers will then venture to the baby dinosaur enclosure, where a life-size LEGO brick Brachiosaurus awaits that weighs well over 2 tonnes! Journey below past a flock of Pteranodons, then learn how to track dinosaurs across the island before encountering escaped Velociraptors Blue and Delta and, of course, an enormous T. rex – a favourite of many *Jurassic World* fans.

In *Jurassic World by Brickman* experience, LEGO fans will have an opportunity to channel their inner ‘Brickman’ with a myriad of activities, from island building, LEGO paleontology and discovery through mystery mosaics, hybrid dinosaur creations, learning to track a dinosaur by creating species footprints, and even building escape vehicles to get away from a Tyrannosaurus Rex. With 2.5 million bricks to play with, creativity will not be in short supply!
