

Experience the powerful true story of *Lost Wolves of Yellowstone* in IMAX opening May 15 at TELUS World of Science – Edmonton

EDMONTON, AB — May 7, 2026 — The visceral true story of one of the most debated and consequential wildlife restoration efforts in modern history comes to the IMAX Theatre at TELUS World of Science – Edmonton, as *Lost Wolves of Yellowstone*, an IMAX® original documentary, immerses audiences in the dramatic return of wolves to Yellowstone, opening May 15.

In 1995, a small group of Canadian grey wolves was released into Yellowstone National Park after a 50-year absence, launching a legendary wildlife restoration project. Using rare, long-lost archival footage and immersive IMAX technology, the film takes audiences back to those tense early days as the wolves acclimate in enclosures before venturing out to establish a new lineage.

As biologists battled legal challenges and public controversy, the wolves faced their own fight for survival, adapting to a changed ecosystem and learning how to hunt and thrive once again in Yellowstone. The documentary also highlights the inspiring story of Mollie Beattie, the first woman to lead the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, whose leadership was instrumental to the project's success.

“Lost Wolves of Yellowstone is a remarkable story of resilience, science, and ecosystems,” said Constance Scarlett, President & CEO of TELUS World of Science – Edmonton. “We’re excited to bring this powerful, thought-provoking documentary to our IMAX screen and give our guests the opportunity to experience this pivotal moment in conservation history in such an immersive way.”

Directed, produced, and written by Emmy® award-winning filmmaker Thomas Winston, the film also features insights from key figures of the Yellowstone Wolf Project, including Mike Phillips, who spearheaded the 1995 reintroduction, and Doug Smith, who led the project for more than 25 years.
